TG1:22 - Standard Edge Protection Designs

In August 2022, the National Access and Scaffolding Confederation (NASC) issued a guidance note, TG1:22 – Temporary Edge Protection, that includes some generic design details for tube and fitting scaffold edge protection.

Appendix A of this guidance contains the following statement in relation to these standard edge protection designs:

"Sheeting, netting, or brick-guards are not permitted, and will require a bespoke design".


Morgan Sindall Construction's policy is that all edge protection constructed from scaffold components will be fitted with brick-guards or other suitable material fall protection, as a result **use of TG1:22 Edge Protection designs are not permitted** on Morgan Sindall Construction projects.

Action:

- When selecting edge protection, please refer to the hierarchy within <u>SHE GUID 13</u> -<u>Manager's Guide - Dropped Objects</u>
- Where scaffold edge protection is to be used, please make your scaffold contractor aware of Morgan Sindall requirements, and ensure a bespoke design is provided.
- Review scaffold edge protection currently installed on projects, and ensure that a suitable bespoke design is in place.
